### ORDER

7<sup>th</sup> State Level High Powered Steering Committee (SHPS) of AMRUT 2.0 held on 14.12.2023 has considered the proposal for issuance of Administrative Sanction for the following two Micro Water Supply Projects of Nileswaram Municipality in Kasargod District and Shreekandapuram Municipality in Kannur District approved under the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> tranches of State Water Action Plan under AMRUT 2.0.

Based on the decision of State Level Technical Committee of AMRUT 2.O, as per the decision read as 1<sup>st</sup> paper above, 7<sup>th</sup> SHPSC of AMRUT 2.O has decided to accord Administrative sanction for an amount of Rs. 1.555 cr. (CAPEX-1.514 Cr. OPEX- 0.041 Cr.) for the above 2 Micro water supply projects, subject to the following conditions

- Mission Director shall give more due priority to the Micro Water Supply projects and the Technical Sanction (TS) shall be issued by the concerned technical committee formed only after meeting the following conditions:
  - The project should be Technically feasible and have a reliable water source and yield potential.
  - The need and necessity for provisioning of safe and potable drinking water supply to the Perole ward Nileswaram is highly justifiable, even as the unit cost is slightly on the higher side (for Perole only) but are reasonable as no other judicious sources of drinking water supply exists in the area of concern. Moreover, the proposed drinking water supply project for Nedyanga Swarnadhara scheme of Shreekandapuram is very much justified and are in accordance with AMRUT guidelines.
  - The necessary clearances from the relevant statute authorities are to be obtained if any by the ULB.
  - The project includes a 5-year Operation & Maintenance plan and only admissible components as per AMRUT guidelines.
- The Central Assistance for urban development projects should not cover the costs of Operation & Maintenance, Supervision charges, or the purchase Value of land/ structures required for the project development. These costs should be borne by the State/ ULB fund if they are unavoidable.

3. As per the letter read as 2<sup>nd</sup> paper above Mission Director, AMRUT

has requested to accord Administrative sanction for two Micro water supply projects of Nileswaram Municipality in Kasargod District and Shreekandapuram Municipality in Kannur District, based on the decision of 7th SHPSC.

4. Government have examined the mater in detail and are pleased to accord Administrative sanction for an amount of **Rs. 1.555 cr. (CAPEX-1.514 Cr. OPEX- 0.041 Cr.)** for two Micro Water Supply Projects of Nileswaram Municipality in Kasargod District and Shreekandapuram Municipality in Kannur District, approved under the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> tranches of State Water Action Plan (SWAP) under AMRUT 2.O, subject to the following conditions:

- Mission Director shall give more due priority to the Micro Water Supply projects and the Technical Sanction (TS) shall be issued by the concerned technical committee formed only after meeting the following conditions:
  - The project should be Technically feasible and have a reliable water source and yield potential.
